INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM required to be held at Unit 806, Level 8, Core D, Cyberport 3, 100 Cyberport Road, Hong Kong on Friday, 30 May 2014 at 2:30 p.m., for the approval of, among other things:

GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SHARES

This is an explanatory statement given to all Shareholders relating to a resolution to be proposed at the AGM authorising the Repurchase Mandate.

This explanatory statement contains information required by Rule 10.06(1)(b) of the Listing Rules which is set out as follows:

1. EXERCISE OF THE REPURCHASE MANDATE

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued ordinary share capital of the Company comprised 3,493,546,000 Shares.

Subject to the passing of Resolution No. 2(ii) set out in the Notice at the AGM and on the basis that no further Shares shall be issued or repurchased prior to the AGM nor outstanding options, if any, granted under the 2003 Share Option Scheme and the 2011 Share Option Scheme being exercised, the authority conferred by Resolution No. 2(ii) will continue in force and the Company shall be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 349,354,600 Shares during the period from the date of passing Resolution No. 2(ii) and ending on the earliest of the conclusion of the next annual general meeting, the date by which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required to be held by the Articles of Association or applicable laws of the Cayman Islands and the date upon which Resolution No. 2(ii) is revoked or varied by Shareholders in general meeting.

2. REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and its Shareholders as a whole for the Directors to have a general authority from Shareholders to enable the Company to repurchase Shares in the market. Such repurchases may, depending on the market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net value of the Company and its assets and/or its earnings per share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such repurchases will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

3. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

Any repurchases will only be funded out of funds of the Company legally available for the purposes in accordance with the Company's memorandum of association and Articles of Association and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands. A listed company may not repurchase its own shares on the Stock Exchange for a consideration other than cash or for settlement otherwise than in accordance with the trading rules of the Stock Exchange from time to time.

Under Cayman Islands law, repurchases by the Company may only be made out of profits of the Company or out of proceeds of a fresh issue of Shares made for the purpose, or, if so authorised by its Articles of Association and subject to the provisions of the Companies Law, out of capital. Any premium payable on a redemption or purchase over the par value of the Shares to be repurchased must be provided for out of profits of the Company or out of the Company's share premium account, or, if so authorised by its Articles of Association and subject to the provisions of the Companies Law, out of capital.

4. STATUS OF REPURCHASED SHARES

The Listing Rules provide that the listing of all repurchased shares shall be automatically cancelled and that the certificates for those shares must be cancelled and destroyed. Under the law of the Cayman Islands, a company's repurchased shares shall be treated as cancelled and its issued share capital (but not the authorised share capital) will be reduced accordingly.

5. EFFECT OF EXERCISE OF THE REPURCHASE MANDATE

There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the audited accounts of the Company for the year ended 31 December 2013) in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

6. DISCLOSURE OF INTERESTS

None of the Directors and, to the best of their knowledge, having made all reasonable enquiries, none of their respective Associates, have any present intention, if the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders, to sell any Shares to the Company.

No connected person (as defined in the Listing Rules) has notified the Company that he has a present intention to sell Shares to the Company if the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders and neither has any of the connected persons undertaken not to sell his Shares to the Company in the event the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

If as a result of a repurchase of Shares, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of the Takeovers Code. As a result, a Shareholder, or a group of Shareholders acting in concert, depending on the level of increase in the Shareholder's interests, may obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code. The Directors are not aware of any consequences which could arise under the Takeovers Code as a consequence of any repurchases of Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Colpo Mercantile Inc. ("Colpo") held 1,188,680,000 Shares, representing approximately 34.03%, and Cool Legend Limited ("Cool Legend") held 452,400,000 Shares, representing approximately 12.95%, of the existing issued share capital of

the Company, respectively. Should the power to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate be exercised in full and assuming there is no change in the issued share capital of the Company and the present shareholding of Colpo and Cool Legend in the Company, Colpo and Cool Legend would then be beneficially interested in approximately 37.81% and 14.39% of the issued ordinary share capital of the Company, respectively. Apart from Colpo and Cool Legend (including their respective connected persons and associates within the meaning of the Listing Rules), the Directors are not aware of any single Shareholder who holds 10% or more of the issued Shares.

On the basis of the shareholding held by the controlling shareholder named above, and based solely on the result of the exercise of the Repurchase Mandate in full, Colpo would not be obliged to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code. As at the Latest Practicable Date, so far as is known to the Directors, no other Shareholder may become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code in the event that the Directors exercise the power in full to repurchase the Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate. The Directors have no intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to an extent as may result in any mandatory offer to be made under the Takeovers Code.

9. SHARE PURCHASE MADE BY THE COMPANY

No repurchases of securities have been made by the Company in the previous six months before the Latest Practicable Date, whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise.

The Company will not repurchase any Shares if that repurchase would result in the number of Shares which are in the hands of the public falling below 25% of the issued share capital of the Company.

Details of the Directors who are required to retire at the AGM according to the Articles of Association and who, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election at the AGM are as follows:

(1) Mr. Chan Wing Him Kenny (“Mr. Chan”), executive Director

Mr. Chan, aged 63, is an executive Director, and the Chairman and CEO of the Company since 29 November 2006 and the chairman and a member of the Management Committee. Mr. Chan has been re-designated as a member of the Remuneration Committee since 29 March 2012.

As the CEO, Mr. Chan is responsible for the Company’s overall strategy and execution of business plans. Mr. Chan has over 33 years of experience in the international natural resources industry through his participation in the business and financial communities in the minerals and energy sectors in North America and Asia. He is in the vanguard of North American natural resource sector financiers who have pioneered new technologies in mining and metal recovery through his promotion and funding of a host of private and public companies. One of North America’s best-known financiers associated with resource development and technology ventures, Mr. Chan has extended his interest and influence internationally through his work in establishing and financing companies around the world including central Asia, the Middle East and Asia-Pacific, including China. Mr. Chan has been a dynamic force for over thirty years in the minerals and energy industries through his activities and has raised hundreds of millions of dollars on international capital markets since the mid-1980’s.

As the founder of the Company with North American financing and natural resources experience and track records, Mr. Chan is able to capitalise on world markets to pursue his vision of assembling a portfolio of natural resources-based interests at critical points of development prior to market takeoff. With an extensive knowledge of industry needs and market demands, Mr. Chan has directed the organisation of a management team capable of creating and growing value in the target sectors.

Mr. Chan is a director of Petromin Resources Ltd. (“Petromin”), a connected person of the Company and which shares are listed on the Toronto Stock Exchange Venture Board. Mr. Chan is a member of The Hong Kong Institute of Directors and Association of International Petroleum Negotiators, respectively. Save as disclosed above, he has not held any directorship in any other listed public companies in the past three years.

Pursuant to the service contract between Mr. Chan and the Company, the length of service of Mr. Chan with the Company is for a term of three years and is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election in accordance with the Articles of Association. As at the Latest Practicable Date, other than holding corporate interest in 1,188,680,000 Shares, representing approximately 34.03% of the issued share capital of the Company and personal interest in 24,681,200 Shares, representing approximately 0.71% of the issued share capital of the Company and 26,000,000 share options of the Company, representing approximately 0.74% of the issued share capital of the Company, Mr. Chan was not interested in the Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO. Save as serving in the management of Petromin together with, among others, Dr. Arthur Ross Gorrell, an executive Director of the Company and a director, chairman, president and chief executive officer of Petromin, Mr. Chan was not connected with any of the Directors, senior management, substantial Shareholders or controlling Shareholders of the Company and their respective Associates.

(2) Mr. David Tsoi (“Mr. Tsoi”), independent non-executive Director

Mr. Tsoi, aged 66, has joined the Company as an independent non-executive Director since 8 July 2008. Mr. Tsoi is also the chairman and a member of the Audit Committee. In addition, he is the managing director of Alliot, Tsoi CPA Limited and an independent non-executive director of MelcoLot Limited (which shares are listed on the Growth Enterprise Market (“GEM”) of the Stock Exchange) and CSR Corporation Limited (which shares are listed on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange).
